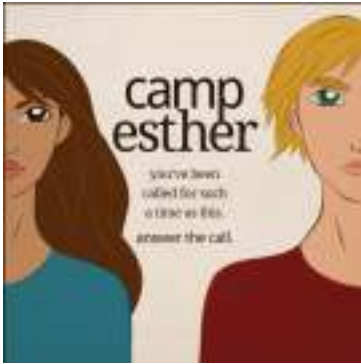

Camp Esther – Basic

July 11-13, 2010 – Nashotah, WI (South)

August 1-3, 2010 – Osceola, WI (North)

Get all of the basic background it takes to become a junior expert on the life issues. Learn how you – one person – can help end the atrocities of abortion and euthanasia in our nation. Sessions blend education, motivation and advocacy into a camp that is intense, powerful and a ton of fun. Recommended for anyone ages junior high through college who wants to know more about getting involved and saving lives. This camp is a pre-requisite for Camp Nehemiah. What you learn at Esther will prepare you for the advanced nature of Nehemiah sessions.

July 14-16, 2010 – Nashotah, WI (South)

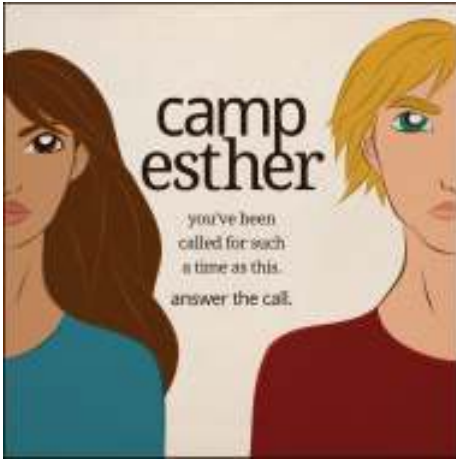
August 4-6, 2010 – Osceola, WI (North)

Sessions include advanced information on all of the life issues, as well as practical hands-on application. Learn how you can “rebuild the wall” that protects life in our nation – right from where you live! Recommended for anyone who has attended Camp Esther and is hungry for more!

This killing will continue, and it will escalate until no one is safe –

unless we stop it. You've been called “for such a time as this.” Will you answer that call?

Camp Esther Sessions 2010

- 1. Legacy of Life: A Pro-Life History Lesson** – You know American history, now it's time to learn your pro-life history! Learn about the issue of abortion from the dawn of civilization to the most recent developments in the fight for life.
- 2. Abortion 101** - A fascinating look at life before birth and the horrors of abortion – it may be gruesome, but you need to know what you're up against in order to fight it effectively!
- 3. How Our Government (Really) Works** - Understand the process of our government as it pertains to the life issues. Ever wonder how a pro-life bill becomes law, or why we have to wait for the Supreme Court to overturn Roe? This should answer those questions and more!
- 4. The (Pro-Life) Laws We Pass** - What are the current right-to-life issues in our state legislature and before Congress in Washington, D.C.? This session will give you an overview of how we're currently fighting to save the lives of the unborn and vulnerable here in Wisconsin and around the nation.
- 5. Euthanasia 101** – It's not just abortion any more – Terri Schindler Schiavo taught us that. Learn the valuable lesson that life is precious at every stage and age and find out how you can help save the medically vulnerable from death at the hands of activist judges and rogue medical professionals.
- 6. Stem Cell Basics** - If the scientific terms make it seem like this is way over your head, you'll be amazed at how simple the facts really are. Learn what the media doesn't want you to know about stem cells!
- 7. True Colors** - Ever wonder what makes you tick, or why some people really tick you off? This will clear that up for you in a big hurry. Learn how to use people's strengths to make a huge difference for the cause of life! (As an added bonus, it will help you understand your family, friends and teachers better, too!)
- 8. Answering the Hard Questions: Abortion** - You know you're pro-life, and you probably have a pretty good idea of why that is, but you just don't know how to answer people who disagree with you! This session will give you the easiest answers to some of the issue's toughest questions. Learn how to answer the hard questions in your sleep!
- 9. Stand in the Gap** – Find out why the mid-term elections in 2010 are so critical to the cause of life and learn how you can help elect right-to-life advocates to all levels of government.
- 10. Answering the Hard Questions: Euthanasia** – Chances are you know less about this issue than you do about abortion. This session will help you frame your arguments against euthanasia and teach you to think on your feet in real life situations.
- 11. How to Debate... and Win!** – Once you have learned the arguments, we'll give you a chance to practice them. Get the basics on how to debate the life issues in casual settings – with family, friends, and others who don't yet understand what is at stake in the fight against abortion, infanticide and euthanasia.

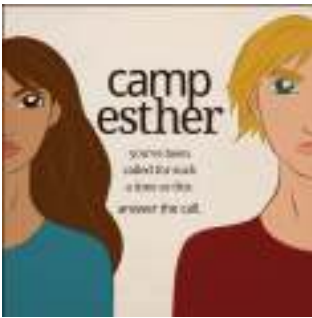

Why Nehemiah?

Because his story shows us what can happen when someone works with dedication and perseverance to rebuild something that is broken – seemingly beyond repair.

Why You?

Because the wall that protects life in our nation is broken – but it's not beyond repair. We need you to help rebuild it, brick by brick. The lives of millions depend on us!

Camp Nehemiah Sessions 2010

- 1. Bioethics: What Does it Mean to be Human?** In a world where there is a growing movement toward treating all living beings as equal, what does it mean to be human? Are we truly intricate and unique creations or are we just another glob of cells? Find out in this session.
- 2. Dutch Euthanasia: Headed for our Shores?** The devaluation of human life in the Netherlands has reached alarming proportions. Find out how this trend started and learn how dangerously close we are to following a similar path right here in the United States.
- 3. Abortion as Genocide** It's a well-known fact that abortion has claimed the lives of more African Americans than did the entire slave trade. So why has this fact gone unnoticed by the mainstream media and why does our first African American president promote it so vehemently?
- 4. Made in China** Since the early 1970s China has enforced a "one-child" policy aimed at controlling their population. The result? An entire generation of boys who can't find mates, a skewed population and the deaths of millions of innocent little girls.
- 5. Population Control: It's Just Plain Crazy!** You've likely heard the myth of the "population bomb" – the notion that our planet would be better off with fewer of us on it. Learn the real facts about overpopulation, the replacement rate and how you can counter the arguments of those who claim that we need to limit the number of children born.
- 6. Media Bias?** Is unbiased journalism all but dead? Why does today's mainstream media report opinion as though it is fact? How can you identify and combat media bias on the issues of abortion and euthanasia? We've got the answers!
- 7. Propaganda – The Deadliest Weapon?** Throughout the ages, those who seek to annihilate people groups have used propaganda to deliver their message to the masses. And, frighteningly enough, it has worked time and time again. How can you recognize it and how can you counter its deadly effect?
- 8. The Abortion Administration** This session will outline the dangerous pro-abortion policies of the Obama Administration. We are not making this stuff up – it's all in the public record. So if you want to learn about how President Obama has promoted abortion and how you can work to protect life, this session is for you. If you are an Obama fan who can't stand to hear his record criticized, you probably want to find a different camp.
- 9. Media Savvy** Sure, they're mostly biased, but how can YOU work with the media to get your message across? Learn to give a great interview, focus on your message and use sound bites to your advantage.
- 10. Post Abortion Syndrome** We know that abortions kill children. What many people don't realize is that abortion also devastates women, men and extended families. Learn how to recognize the symptoms and help those who are trapped in its grip.
- 11. Reaching Minorities for Life** How do we spread the message in the Hispanic, African American and other minority communities that are hardest hit by abortion? Learn to educate a wide spectrum of the population on the life issues.

- 12. Amazing Grace** You've heard of William Wilberforce who led the anti-slavery movement to victory in England – but this version of the story is even better as it shows how you can use the same type of perseverance to help end abortion and euthanasia in modern day America.
- 13. How to be a Leader for Life** Leadership isn't always about being popular – it's about doing the right thing and standing up for truth. Learn how you can lead others to help restore a respect for life in our nation.
- 14. Social Movements in History** Pro-lifers aren't the first group of people to stand up in the face of unjust laws. In fact, we are only the most recent generation in a long line of people who have noticed injustice and risked their lives, their liberties and their fortunes to end it.
- 15. It's About Focus!** So you know why you're pro-life and now you even think you can articulate it as you discuss the issue outside of your pro-life circle. Learn how to focus your argument and avoid being sidetracked by the opposition. Become the best advocate for life that you can.
- 16. World Update** Think SNL's weekend update, only totally focused on the life issues. We deal with tough subject matter, so let this session lighten things up for you. We guarantee you'll laugh... and learn!
- 17. The Life and Legacy of Terri Schiavo** It has been five years since her death by starvation and dehydration. What have we learned and what more do we have yet to learn in order to restore a respect for life to our nation?

Note: Actual session topics will vary between North and South camps.

Notes of Interest:

1. There are separate registration prices for Wisconsin residents and people from other states. This is not because we love Wisconsin people more... it is simply because the actual cost per person/per camp is over \$135, but WRTL covers part of the expense for Wisconsin teens who will be volunteering within the state in the coming year.
2. You will notice that we have an early registration deadline which includes a price break. **Please take advantage of this...** it saves you money and helps us give accurate food and room counts to our hosting facilities. Also, there will be a limited number of spaces available for South camp and it will be first come, first serve.
3. We will do our best to get your camp t-shirt in your size, but please note that we only guarantee this if we receive your registration by June 10, 2010 which is when we have to order them to have them in time for camps.
4. If you will be driving from out of state and bringing an adult chaperone with you, please let us know in advance if the chaperone will need lodging and/or meals. Both will be available for whatever it costs us to house and/or feed them, but we need to know well in advance. Due to limited space, chaperones at South camp may have to stay off-site in a nearby hotel.
5. **If you are attending from out of state and will be flying, please call Joleigh to discuss airport pick-ups.** Both camps are about an hour from the nearest airport, so pick-ups will have to be carefully scheduled and you may end up waiting at the airport for other campers to arrive. (But it will totally be worth it!)
6. Both camps are held in dorm facilities with plenty of electricity to go around. You will need to bring your own twin bed linens (or sleeping bag,) pillow and towels, but other than that, it's pretty modern. By "camp" we really mean "fun, camp-like activities in a fairly cushy setting." None of us are into outdoor plumbing or working by flashlight, either! ☺
